

Parents and Godparents are required to attend a meeting in the Rectory. All Godparents must have received the sacrament of Confirmation.

MATRIMONY

All Catholics should only marry in the Catholic Church. A Catholic marriage requires a time of preparation of at least one year. Therefore, parishioners should first meet with the priest before making any arrangements of date and time, or booking of the banquet.

INGREDIENTS

1 package dry yeast


1 1/2 cups warm water

1 tsp. sugar

1/2 tsp. salt

Water to hold salt on

Latin - Bracellae "Little arms", the original Lenten bread dating back to the 4th century.



Divide into 12 pieces and roll each into a "rope" about 10-12 inches long. Form into a pretzel and place on baking sheet, brush with water and sprinkle with kosher salt. Let rise slightly and bake at 425° about 12-15 minutes.



Flip ends over to resemble arms crossed over chest -praying little arms



BEYOND BAPTISM



Eucharistic Saint of the Month Saint Gertrude



St. Gertrude was born in Biennio Brescia, Italy in 1837 into a large family. From early childhood she was always aware of the presence of God, especially in the Eucharist. She was drawn to prayer in the presence of the tabernacle At the age of seven, unable to resist any longer the pressing invitation of Jesus, one day, in the very early morning, she wrapped herself in her mother's black shawl and went to the nearby Saint Mary's Church, Standing at the balustrade, she secretly made her First Comn experienced a "heavenly" feeling and swore eternal love to Jesus. The child became more serious, meditative and more absorbed in the thought of Jesus present in the Eucharist who, she realized, was often left alone for many days. At the age of 15, Gertrude wanted to join the convent. Because of illness she was forced to wait. She worked as a domestic worker for a priest.

thile still young, she became an Apostle of the Eucharist: she would have liked to take Jesus present in the Holy acrament onto the top of a high mountain so that everyone could see and adore Him.

In the Feast of Corpus Christi of 1878, with the permission of her confessor, she made the vow of chastity, which



1880, while in Rome with the Fé-Vitali's, she succeeded in speaking with Pope Leo XIII about her plans to stablish a religious institute devoted to the adoration of the Eucharist. The Pope changed them by inviting her to clude the education of young female factory workers as well.

On Dec. 15, 1882 she founded the Congregation of the Sacramentine Sisters of Bergamo. Its focus was on adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and education. The sisters committed their lives to prayer and helping those who were

t. Gertrude was canonized in 2009 by Pope Benedict XVI, and her feast day is February 18 St. Gertrude died of natural causes while praying in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in 1903

2024 LENTEN REGULATIONS

The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

- The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
- The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the <u>First Sunday of</u>
 <u>Lent. February 18</u> to <u>The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, May 26, 2024.</u>

*Canon 920, §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year
